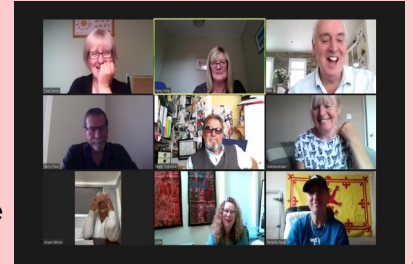




ELTRP UPDATE:

Hello, from Hallhill Tenants and Residents Association. Just a quick update on our activities and progress so far this year.

Hallhill Tenants and Residents Association is situated in the Hallhill area of Dunbar. Hallhill Tenants and Residents Association was formed in November 2018 and represents both Tenants and Residents of c660 households.

2019 ended on a positive note. A special committee meeting held with key stakeholders saw positive action in taking forward the issue of adoption of roads.

2020 gets off to a good start with developers we are told now having submitted all paperwork to ELC to move this forward.

Our current activity includes participating in the Planning Consultation process regarding Hallhill North and Hallhill Development Spott Road Dunbar. These developments will have a major impact on the road network – increased traffic volume, noise, and use of the A1 junction (Hospital Road) all of which present as risks to having 'safe roads' Safer Roads is priority for the Area Partnership Board.

Finally a big thank you to Stevie Tait and Malcolm Smail, two of our committee who have been very active during this Covid-19 lockdown. They have organised beetle drives, street bingo, balloon sculpting lessons for residents / tenants on a Thursday evening coinciding with the 'clap for carers' Stevie and Malcolm will be continuing the bingo sessions on Thursday evenings.

EAST LoTHIAN COUNCIL UPDATE

Recycling Sites to re-open
but new guidelines in place to protect service users and staff

Visitors to an East Lothian Recycling Site must:

- ◆ Produce proof of East Lothian residency such as driving licence, Council Tax letter to be shown through your car window to our staff – no ID = no access.
- ◆ Not travel to any recycling centre if you are showing any signs of infection, have a member of your household showing symptoms, or are self-isolating due to COVID-19.
- ◆ Be aware of the limit on the number of vehicles allowed onto the tipping areas. This will operate on a **one in one out system** and will inevitably lead to **long queues at peak times**.
- ◆ Remain at least 2 metres away from staff and other site users in line with social distancing measures.
- ◆ Be physically able to lift and carry anything you bring. Staff at the centres will not be able to assist you with any unloading.
- ◆ Make sure only one adult per vehicle should get out of the vehicle to unload and dispose of items.
- ◆ Keep all children within your vehicle at all times for their safety and protection.
- ◆ Be aware that pedestrian access to the recycling centres is not permitted
- ◆ Note that last vehicle will be admitted at 6.15pm in line with waste management licensing conditions.

The Staff and EC members continue to work from home and meet through Zoom and Skype,
